2026 ANNUAL RECIPIENTS



HOPE Program Startup: To startup Helping Other People Eternally by including updated safety equipment and training to allow opportunities for patients to age in place.



Senior Food Access Initiative: To start a new program that will address the escalating concerns among older adults dealing with food insecurities.



Unfunded Care for Serious Illness: To partially fund hospice and palliative care to over 1,600 lowcountry residents.



Living Well, Planning Wisely: To fund the program providing free estate and health care planning for low-income elderly citizens.



Adult Day Memory Care Respite Program: To provide needed and essential respite for caregivers.



More Than a Meal® Program: To fund delivery of fresh hot meals daily to the homes of those that are homebound, isolated, aged residents.



Senior Care Transition Program: To provide structured, individual support for uninsured patients approaching age 65 to help them deal with delays in transitioning to federal health care programs.

2026 DISCRETIONARY RECIPIENTS



Replace the "ABC Scholarship" Program: To provide 50% of the financial assistance terminated by the state that subsidized the annual tuition for programs that provide high-quality early education for needy families.



Upgrading Examination Tables: To fund the replacement of one of thirteen aging (1993) exam tables that can no longer be properly sanitized and lack accessibility features, posing safety risks for elderly patients and those with mobility limitations.



Facility Safety Upgrade: To fund the upgrade of the interior fire suppression system now required by the recent changes to the fire code.



Education and Rehabilitation: To provide prevention, education, and outreach program to youth and families affected by substance abuse, and to provide financial assistance for individuals to attend a 90-day rehabilitation program.



Helping Neighbors Fund: To support CFL's new program to combat food insecurity that has increased due to the delays with SNAP funding.
